Matching statements

The most common types of asbestos	Chrysotile (white) Amosite (brown) Crocidolite (blue)
Asbestos	A group of naturally occurring, fibrous minerals
Face fit test	Should be carried out if you are issued with a half mask respirator
If you suspect asbestos	Stop work immediately, warn others to keep out of the area and inform your supervisor
Neverassume that all of the asbestos located in a building has been found
Friable	Easily reduced to smaller, finer elements
Asbestos workers who smoke	Increased risk of lung cancer
Asbestosis	A chronic inflammatory and scarring disease, affecting the tissue of the lungs
Mesothelioma	A malignant form of lung cancer
Employer duty	Provide information and training, refreshed on a regular basis
Low fibre release when disturbed	Vinyl floor tiles, asbestos cement sheet products...
High fibre release when disturbed	Loose fill lagging, sprayed on insulation..
One-thousandth of a millimetre is equal to micron/s	1
A human hair is around micron/s in diameter	100
A respirable particle is generally less than micron/s	10
Inhalable particles	Generally deposited in the respiratory tract
Respirable particles	Will reach the gas exchange region of the lung
Every week tradesmen die from asbestos-related diseases	20
